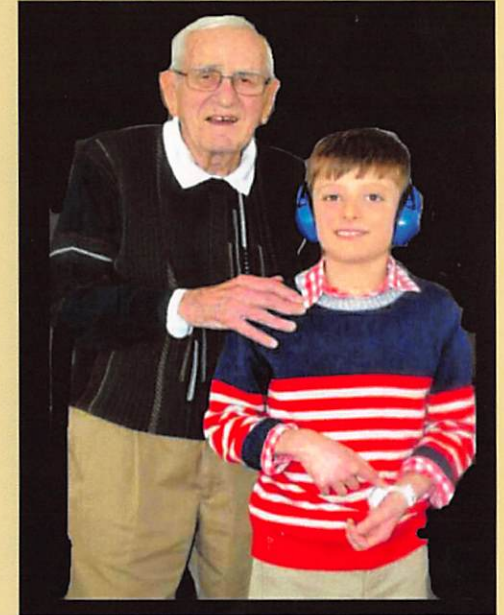

What is PLS?

PLS is a non-profit organization that developed a tracking system used nationwide to locate persons who have a tendency to wander and become lost.



Project Lifesaver is a program of pro-active involvement and specialized rescue operations where trained personnel respond to incidents involving persons with autism, dementia, Alzheimer's, Down syndrome and other related neurological disorders.

This program will cut the costs of searching for frequent wanderers and ultimately recover the lost participant within a short period of time. Currently there have been over 2,765 search and rescues nationwide, with a 100% recovery rate!

The tracking receiver has a ground range of up to one mile. Using the receiver in a helicopter increases the range to approximately 5-7 miles.



How does PLS work?

PLS participants wear a small transmitter that emits a silent radio signal.



Once a caretaker or family member realizes their loved one has wandered, they contact 911.

Project Lifesaver's trained personnel are dispatched to the last known location of the person who wandered to begin the search.
